Repertoire Guidelines



Repertoire is chosen from below “Sample Repertoire” ([see below/pg 2 of these guidelines](#)) or from Luck’s Music Library (www.lucksmusic.com; 800-348-8749; see below for search suggestions) that meets the following criteria:

- Should not exceed 7 minutes in total length (can do an excerpt from a longer work) including any orchestra alone sections and is classical repertoire with conventional orchestral accompaniment (note that the SBC is a chamber orchestra; pieces with larger orchestral forces may be adapted as needed). If needed, employ cuts and/or do a single movement of a work to comply with the 7 minute limit. (For full competition rules, see “Application Information” PDF found under the “SBC Concerto” tab on the SBC website: www.sinfoniettabelcanto.org)
- Previous SBC Concerto Competition finalists/winners must audition on different repertoire than their respective finalist/winner repertoire.
- Orchestra parts must be available for purchase, **NOT rental**.
- Price for orchestra parts may not exceed \$150. [SBC will procure the orchestra parts.]
- On the Luck’s website, the piece’s listing must indicate a “Set” with a price and usually a string count.
- If Luck’s website states “Score”, this does NOT mean individual orchestra parts; it must state “Set”.
- Here is a sample Luck’s listing: “Set: \$ 70.00”
(Set includes strings 4-4-3-2-2)
- If you can’t find a particular piece on Luck’s [www](http://www.lucksmusic.com), contact Luck’s directly. (Luck’s catalog is very large.)
- Pieces will need to be composed before 1930 (and also need to be available for purchase, **NOT rental**, as stated above.)

Luck’s catalog can be searched online or downloaded. [Download “Symphonic/Orchestral” catalog(s). You can also get a hard copy if you request it.] Online—via Luck’s website search, not the downloaded PDF—is the most complete/up-to-date listing, but it can be sensitive; when you search Luck’s website, use basic terms: composer’s last name, major words in title. Try variants—different language, etc...—if needed. You can also contact Luck’s to inquire about a specific piece, if needed. Sample Repertoire (If piece is listed below, no need to check Luck’s.)

Again these are just samples; some “standard” solos and some instruments aren’t listed.
 You can pick other pieces/instruments as long as it meets the above & other competition guidelines.
 Also, if needed, employ cuts and/or do a single movement of a work to comply with the 7 minute limit.
